






# From Our Gardens to Yours – Plant Sale 2017 – House Plants

	<p><b>Aloe</b> – House Plant / 6-8 inches tall, full sun / <i>Aloe vera</i> is used both internally and externally on humans, and is claimed to have some medicinal effects, which have been supported by scientific and medical research. It readily grows additional shoots and can be easily divided to share with friends.</p>
	<p><b>Boston Fern</b> – House Plant / Annual / 12 – 18 inches / Shade to Bright Light – Boston Ferns need bright light and even moisture. They will enjoy a summer outside in a shady location. They are good in hanging baskets and container gardens.</p>
	<p><b>Christmas Cactus</b> – House Plant / 12 inches – bright light but avoid direct sunlight – Christmas Cactus blooms come in several different colors. The blooming cycle is triggered by cool long nights (12-14 hours of darkness). Do not allow to dry completely between watering intervals but do give it less water during its dormant cycle after blooming. They can be propagated by taking cutting of several segments. Allow the segments to dry for a few hours before potting.</p>
	<p><b>Wandering Jew</b> – Annual/House Plant / 6-8 inches – Wandering Jew needs bright light to maintain its color. It will spread easily and root where it touches the ground. It should be kept slightly moist. It works well as an annual in a hanging basket. Cuttings can be taken in the fall to pot up for a house plant.</p>
	<p><b>Unknown</b> – We sometimes have things in our homes but are not sure exactly what they are. Still we like them and are willing to share.</p>
