








From Our Gardens to Yours – Plant Sale 2019 – House Plants

	<p>Christmas Cactus – House Plant / 12 inches – bright light but avoid direct sunlight – Christmas Cactus blooms come in several different colors. The blooming cycle is triggered by cool long nights (12-14 hours of darkness). Do not allow to dry completely between watering intervals but do give it less water during its dormant cycle after blooming. They can be propagated by taking cutting of several segments. Allow the segments to dry for a few hours before potting.</p>
	<p>False African Violet – House Plant / 4 inches / bright light not full sun Will do well in north or east window. Light mauve continuous bloom.</p>
	<p>Jade Plant – House Plant / can grow to 2 feet tall Needs sunny window. Allow to dry out between watering except in spring growing season. Can be propagated by cuttings. May enjoy summer outside. Prune to encourage branching.</p>
	<p>Scented Geranium – House Plant / Full Sun May enjoy a summer outside.</p>
	<p>Succulents – House Plant / Full Sun / Various Heights May enjoy a summer outside.</p>

	<p>Wandering Jew – Annual/House Plant / 6-8 inches – Wandering Jew needs bright light to maintain its color. It will spread easily and root where it touches the ground. It should be kept slightly moist. It works well as an annual in a hanging basket. Cuttings can be taken in the fall to pot up for a house plant.</p>
	<p>Unknown – We sometimes have plants in our homes but are not sure exactly what they are. Still we like them and are willing to share.</p>
