HANOVER, VA., 4/13/2018 – Virginia Cooperative Extension will celebrate the volunteers who improve the lives of Hanover County residents during National Volunteer Week, a time dedicated to demonstrating to the nation that by working together, we have the fortitude to meet our challenges and accomplish our goals.

National Volunteer Week, April 15-21, 2018, is about taking action and encouraging individuals and their communities to be at the center of social change — discovering and demonstrating their collective power to make a difference.

The cumulative effort of Virginia Cooperative Extension volunteer contributions in Hanover County for 2017 equated to \$ 710,664 in effort. VCE Hanover Volunteer hours exceeded 29,000 including: 4- H adult volunteers, 4- H member volunteers, Master Gardeners, Food Demonstration volunteers, Tree Stewards, Landcare Stewards and Water Stewards, Agriculture producers, and One-time Occasional volunteers.

Hanover Master Gardeners and Stewards will be recognized May 5, 2018, 6:30 pm during the regularly scheduled member meeting to be held at Hanover Evangelical Church.
