

## Common Lawn Weeds

1. Hairy Bittercress (*Cardamine hirsuta*) - annual, late winter/early spring weed



2. Annual Bluegrass (*Poa annua*) - annual, late fall/ winter weed





3. Mouseear Chickweed (*Cerastium vulgatum*) - perennial, early spring weed



4. Speedwell (*Veronica sp.*) - annual, winter/early spring



5. Ground Ivy/Creeping Charlie (*Glechoma hederacea*) - perennial, creeping weed



6. Common Chickweed (*Stellaria media*) - annual, spring weed





7. Purple Deadnettle (*Lamium purpurea*) - annual, spring weed



8. Indian Mock Strawberry (*Duchesnea indica*) - perennial, creeping weed





9. Lesser Celandine/Fig Buttercup (*Ficaria verna*) - highly invasive, perennial weed of wet areas, yellow flower resembles native marsh marigold





10. Japanese Stilt Grass (*Microstegium vimineum*) - highly invasive annual grass, seeds remain in ground and germinate for years
