INTERN TO MASTER GARDENER

- From end of class – 15 months to complete
 - 50 hours of volunteer service which must include
 - 1. Public Education (ES) - An Intern is REQUIRED to work AT LEAST 4 hours at the Help Desk (ES3)
 - 2. Youth/School Programs (YH1)
 - 3. Quality of Life (QL)
 - 4. Administrative Support (VM) - ONLY 10 hours of VM credits count towards the Intern's required 50 hours –
 - An Intern is REQUIRED to complete the Civil Rights Training (VM-6)
