




Extension Master Gardeners are trained volunteer educators. We work within our local communities to encourage and promote environmentally sound horticulture practices through sustainable landscape management education and training.






The Master Gardener program brings the resources of Virginia's land-grant universities - Virginia Tech and Virginia State University - to the people of the Commonwealth.

Home Visit Program

The team visits HOAs, schools, and homes that have requested suggestions for projects. Following each site visit, the Home Visit Team researches and prepares a comprehensive written summary of our findings and recommendations including links to relevant science-based information and fact sheets on suggested plants.

In 2022 the team visited and provided information to one school and three HOAs. A visit to the Atlee Little League grounds to offer advice for native plantings is planned next.

Beaverdam Elementary School: Native Plants and Pollinator Garden created for students for permanent plant identification. 50 participants, 5-10 volunteers; 300+ viewed by entire school and staff

Butterfly Garden in Pole Green Park





The garden was constructed in 1999 in a joint effort by the Hanover County Parks and Recreation EarthSavers Club and HMGA with the help of donations from the community.

After years of neglect, Laurel Mathew (LGBG) replanted the garden and the MGs started maintaining it again, and it is an excellent example of butterfly-loving plants. All of the plants have labels giving their names plus additional information. Most plants are native or cultivars of natives and are for dry areas. The garden is a pollinator magnet visited by a variety of bees, wasps, and flies of all sorts.

Ground was broken on a Horticultural Learning Center in Hanover County on October 14. The center, a multi-year project undertaken by Hanover Master Gardeners, will sit on 1.10 acres next to the Taylor Complex building at 13015 Taylor Complex Lane, Ashland VA 23005.

County Administrator John A. Budesky said the center will serve the community for many years to come. He noted that agriculture is still the #1 business in Hanover County and thanked the Master Gardeners for their work, including providing much volunteer support to the County's COVID-19 community vaccination efforts.

The Fall cleanup of the garden with parents and teacher was a success!






