1. Apply, interview and be accepted into the Master Gardener Training Program:

- ✓ Attend the Open House
- ✓ Complete the online application
- ✓ Provide references and undergo a Background check
- ✓ Have an Informational Interview to learn more about the program
- ✓ Pay your fees after accepted

2. Complete the training course as a **TRAINEE** (~60 hours):

- Basic botany
- Soils and nutrient management
- Plant propagation
- Pruning
- Basic entomology (insects)
- Plant disease diagnosis
- Pesticide use
- Vegetables

Speakers are experts in their fields.

Hands-on exercises are part of some classes.

Passing an open-book exam and giving a presentation are required.

Arrangements must be made for missed classes.

Attendance at each session is highly encouraged.

3. Complete 50 hours of educational volunteer service as an INTERN

by volunteering in Hanover APPROVED PROJECTS that focus on **PUBLIC EDUCATION**. Internship hours completed within 12 months of finishing the classroom portion.

4. After Internship, you are certified as an EXTENSION MASTER GARDENER (EMG).

Maintain EMG status by completing a minimum of 20 hours of volunteer service and eight hours of approved Continuing Education annually per calendar year.
